

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

1. What is CMARN?

CMARN is the Climate Mobility Africa Research Network. It was established in November 2021 with the following objectives:

- To **promote and facilitate critical and independent research** on law and policy responses to disaster and climate change-related human mobility in Africa, including as recommended by the 'Research Agenda for Advancing Law and Policy Responses to Displacement and Migration in the Context of Disasters and Climate Change' (the main output of the Virtual Workshop Series);
- To **foster collaboration between researchers and policy experts** with the goal of supporting evidence-based development and implementation of law and policy responses to displacement and migration in the context of disasters and climate change; and
- To **develop knowledge and capacity among researchers** in and from Africa on these issues, including early career researchers.

2. What is 'climate mobility'?

'Climate mobility' refers to all forms of human mobility that occur in the context of natural hazards, disasters, environmental degradation and climate change. These include : (forced) displacement, (voluntary) migration, planned relocation and evacuations. CMARN aims to advance research relating to law and policy responses to climate mobility in Africa. Relevant law and policy responses include continental, regional and national frameworks in fields such as climate change, disaster risk management, migration, free movement of persons, transhumance, human rights, refugee protection, IDP protection and planned relocation.

3. How was CMARN established?

CMARN was established following the Virtual Workshop Series on [Developing a Research and Policy Agenda for Addressing Displacement and Migration in the Context of Disasters and Climate Change in Africa](#), which took place from April to July 2021, as a platform for further collaboration between participants in the Virtual Workshop Series and others working on this issue.

4. Is CMARN bi-lingual?

Yes, CMARN is run in English and French. Interpretation will be provided for all core CMARN events (see Q. 13).

5. How is CMARN managed?

6. Who can join?

7. What are the benefits of being a 'Member' of CMARN?

- Receive regular communications about research, resources and opportunities relating to displacement and migration in the context of disasters and climate change in Africa.
